

Strasburg C-3 Board of Education
April 19, 2021
Board Meeting- Media Summary

The board approved the consent agenda, which included the minutes of the March 18, 2021, regular meeting, payment of bills, and the March financial report. The board also heard an administrative report. Shannon Whited and Marilyn McClure took the Oath of Office and were sworn in as board members. The current Board of Education was dissolved and new officers were elected:

Under New Business:

The Board updated Policy 0311, Policy and Regulation 3165, and Policy 4120. The board approved the Pleasant Hill tuitions agreement with no increase in tuition for the 21-22 School Year. Tuition for each student attending the Pleasant Hill School District will remain \$8379.00/student. After hearing a preliminary budget update, the board voted to add \$500 to the Certified Salary Schedule, raising the base pay to \$34,490.00. Classified staff will receive the equivalent raise of 2.79%. The board selected ServiceMark Telecom to install and provide phone service for the 21-22 school year. \$15,109.00 will be paid to ServiceMark for the installation of 23 phones into district classrooms and offices. The monthly cost will drop from \$400/month with our current provider to \$117.75/month.

The board held an executive session taking the following actions:

Approved extra duty stipends for the 2021-2022 school year.
Approved a COVID-19 training stipend: staff will complete training outside of contracted time.
Approved the Summer Curriculum Camp stipend for teachers for the June 2021 Curriculum training.
Approved a contract for Raeanne Plowman to serve as our Title Reading Teacher.
The board also heard personnel updates and approved to rehire classified staff for the 21-22 School Year.
